# Parishes of Newry & Saval

Sunday 15th September 2024 The Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I heard someone described as "a priestly priest," and wondered what it meant. Whatever else it might mean, it meant that he matched perfectly somebody's idea of a priest - an uncertain distinction in itself. A priest of my acquaintance received a standing ovation after a sermon, and was glowing for days, until another priest said to him, "I shouldn't be so happy about it: Jesus preached and they crucified him; you preached and they gave you a standing ovation!"

Jesus was the exact opposite of what he was expected to be: he was an unmessianic Messiah. In the popular mind the Messiah was expected to be a powerful military and political leader who would bring his people to victory over all their enemies, in the name of God of course. When Peter called him Messiah, he was "sternly rebuked" and told not to repeat it. Instantly Jesus began to speak of suffering instead: "He began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering...and be put to death" (today's reading). Suffering and death were no part of the image of Messiah, but rather victory.

Christians speak of Christ's "victory over sin and death." He achieved this victory not by killing but by dying. St Augustine said he was "victor and victim; and victor because he was the victim."

This striking expression reverses all our notions about victory and defeat. Indeed the Cross of Christ reverses all our values: success and failure, power and weakness, glory and shame, wealth and poverty, belonging and rejection, even life and death.... His greatest disciples understood this well: St Paul wrote, "I will not boast, except of my weaknesses" (2 Corinthians 12:5), and "when I am weak then I am strong" (2 Corinthians 12:10). It is only by the grace of God that this revolution can shape our lives. We are blessed if we experience it at all, even if only in special moments. The hierarchy of the Western Church moved quite comfortably into the Imperial world of power and palaces and purple - the original secularisation of the Church. A cardinal in all his regalia is a much more secularised figure than a scruffy priest in denim. But fundamentally secularisation is a state of mind. What matters is that a disciple should "have the mind of Christ" (1 Corinthians 2:16).

Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

#### **MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR**

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus heads for Jerusalem where death awaits him. Yet, some who walked with Jesus did not understand who Jesus really was, so they left him because of what true discipleship required. His saving mission and his role as the Christ or Messiah would be defined and expressed through suffering. Judging from Peter's reaction to him, it is clear that Jesus' contemporaries did not expect their long-awaited Messiah to be anything but a regal, powerful strong leader. Their hopes rested on an end to foreign occupation and the restoration of Israel's political freedom and prestige. They were thinking not as God does but as human beings do. And who would fault them for that? Who would want to suffer? Most of our lives we spend avoiding suffering or we put up with it for a while leaving it only an unpleasant memory. Nevertheless, despite the pain attached to suffering, Jesus challenges His followers to choose it as a means of redemption. To take up one's cross does not mean accepting the difficulties of life, as one might say, 'my arthritis is my cross to bear' or 'my mother-in-law is my cross'. Rather, to take up one's cross is a free voluntary choice that calls for desire and resolve, not passing acceptance or mere miserable tolerance. Those who willingly accept the suffering that results from their belonging to Jesus – who accept the hardship by living the Gospel, these are the ones who are truly Jesus' followers. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran pastor who died under Nazi tyranny, stated that discipleship means allegiance to the suffering Christ, and it is therefore not at all surprising that Christians should be called upon to suffer. We, for our part, are to be mindful that whatever we endure, it is for Jesus' sake and that of the Gospel and only then will our suffering have redemptive significance. So, Jesus asks, 'who do people say I am?' He tells them that if they are willing to lose their lives for His sake and for the sake of the Gospel, they will thereby save their present lives and receive the gift of life eternal.
