Sunday 3rd November 2024 The Thirty First Sunday in Ordinary Time

This was a remarkably friendly exchange between Jesus and the scribe, and it stands in strong contrast with the two exchanges just before it in Mark's gospel. They pay each other handsome compliments. Perhaps this was put there to show that Jesus' teaching is not necessarily in conflict with the best of what was before. In other words, a bridge between the two is possible.

The scribe asked Jesus to mention one law, but he mentioned two. This was the clearest way of saying that they cannot be separated. Between these two there is a bridge: there is no real love of God without love of neighbour, and no deep or lasting love of neighbour without love of God. (But many love God unawares.) If these two cannot be separated, they are really only one in practice - like two hands. (In Irish a person who has lost one hand is said to be ar leath-lámh, "half-handed.")

How important it is to construct bridges! A bridge is the other side made attainable; it enables you to hope. It was one of St Catherine of Siena's favourite images; she pictured Christ as a bridge. In her Dialogue, the Father says to her, "I made a bridge of my Son as he lived in your company. And though that living bridge has been taken from your sight, there remains the bridgeway of his teaching, which... is held together by my power and my Son's wisdom and the mercy of the Holy Spirit."

Coming back to Jesus' answer to the scribe: it was the scribes' own answer. Strict orthodox Jews wore little leather sachets (phylacteries) around their wrists, containing two verses from Scripture. (They still do, when they are at prayer.) One of these verses was, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul" (Deuteronomy 11:13), and the other was, "You must love your neighbour as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18).

#### MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

We should never lose sight of what Jesus said: that we should love others as we do ourselves. Many of us do not love ourselves, choosing self-deprecation over self-glory. Indeed, many of us have a warped and unhealthy understanding of self-love. The right kind of self-love is not being selfish but honouring the temple that houses God. So, whilst we are asked to remain humble and obedient, there is absolutely nothing wrong with looking after ourselves, taking care of ourselves, and being gentle on ourselves when times are tough. After all, if we cannot do this, then how are we going to learn to bestow love upon others?

Love, then, is not easy. We are asked to love ourselves, to love others and to love God. If we are the ship, then to where do we steer? What chart do we use to point the way? Well, ultimately, we learn of God's love through fundamental channels: through Scripture, and through our family and loved ones. In terms of the former, then we are in a wonderful position to hear his voice through Scripture this weekend and every day at Mass. The liturgical year is an unparalleled teacher of the Bible, as it presents to us a rolling story of God's love year in, year out. In terms of the latter, then we must own the fact that we have a duty to teach love to those close to us, to pass it on. Too many times history has shown us how a widescale dearth of love can impact on entire generations.

And remember, that is a doing thing, a verb. As the saying goes: 'Love is as love does.' When we pray let us thank God for the gift of His love and ask Him to come closer to Jesus' ideal of human love in all that we do and say, especially around those who challenge us or whom we may find difficult to bear.
