The First Sunday of Advent

The Advent liturgy is shot through with a great longing for Christ. But John the Baptist is constantly putting in an appearance - almost to the point of irritation. What is the meaning of this?

We have to experience the absence of Christ in order later to experience his presence. We need to learn how to wait. Waiting is one of the hardest things for us nowadays. There is such urgency about even the smallest things in our modern world, and this of course is greatly aggravated by commercial advertising. But Advent is a four-week course on waiting.

"Zero wait state," the computer manual said the goal was. It means no waiting at all: you press the key, and the programme (or whatever) is instantly on the screen. Computers are the great accelerators of all sorts of processes (banking, accounting, shopping, etc.) and they themselves are becoming faster and faster. But for the ordinary user, such high speed is required only to run games - which are themselves the greatest time-wasters in the world! The speed of our world today is full of contradictions. We rush to save time in order to be able to waste it!

Time is money, we say. And sure enough, we do with money what we do with time: many rush to save more and more of it in order to waste it on things they don't need or even want.

Can the equation be carried even farther? Time is money; but what is time? What is your time? It is you, it is yourself, your life. Time is life. Do we save our life in order to waste it? It seems we do. "Whoever tries to save his life will lose it," said Jesus (Luke 17:37).

We rush headlong into the future: it is a kind of greed for more and more life, or at least for more and more experience. The future, we feel, will fulfil us, where the past and present have failed. But we rush at it so fast that it gets no chance to fulfil us! We rush past it in the same instant that it becomes the present: because we are forever hurtling ourselves into the future. We badly need to study waiting.

No one can say with full clarity what the reason is (or the cluster of reasons) for the high incidence of suicide in modern western societies. People have made various suggestions. One suggestion is that we no longer know how to wait for anything. In older times, struggle and working for something and waiting for it to be realised, were the normal experience. It may be that 'zero wait state' has really got into us. Advent, the season of waiting, has something to teach us. "Prepare the way of the Lord!" shouted Isaiah. He meant "Repair the road!" Jerusalem is surrounded by desert, and ancient roads quite easily became buried in sand. When some great person was expected, the roads had to be prepared.

Roads are about communication and getting around. The roads that need attention now are inner ones. The underlying problem is a spiritual one. The Western world is seen by many to be spiritually lost - clogged with material possessions and confused with too much information about everything. Advent is the season for unclogging the path and for putting up clearer sign-posts. It is a season for repairing the roads. And learning to wait.

The celebrant then raises the chalice above the altar and says:

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink.

Bowing, the celebrant says quietly:

Priest: With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God.

Then the celebrant washes his hands, saying quietly:

Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

- Priest: The mystery of faith.
- All: When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.
- Priest: Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection,

we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation, giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you.

Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.

Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Francis our Pope and N. our Bishop and all the clergy.

Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your face. Have mercy on us all, we pray, that with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her spouse, with the blessed Apostles, and all the Saints who have pleased you throughout the ages, we may merit to be coheirs to eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ.

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MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

When we think of the end of the world, we often focus on disaster and loss of judgement. But the end of something can also be the beginning of something new and life giving. As one author expressed it: 'What the caterpillar calls the end of the world, someone else terms a butterfly'.

The birth of God in Jesus is the beginning of our own birth into life with God. With the season of Advent, a new liturgical year begins. Year C is a year when we are called to look back with gratitude on all that has been and to look forward with hope to what will be – 'a towering miracle of God's visit to this planet'. Born of Mary from the line of David, God has come to us in the person of Jesus. He is referred to as the 'just shoot' celebrated by the prophet Jeremiah in the First Reading this weekend. Through His words and works, Jesus has established God's justice on earth. All who believe and are bound to God in love and hope are also bound to one another. Those so bound, insists St. Paul are to increase in love for one another and for all people – to conduct themselves at all times in a manner that honours God and God's greatest gift to humankind, Jesus Christ. Our rejoicing in the fact that God has actually been here is half the meaning of Advent. The other half focuses our attention on the second coming of Christ, which is described in the Gospel this weekend. Although the language is symbolic and God appears in power and glory, illusion will give way to reality and the King will be seen for who He is. We, for our part, are to be vigilant at all times and to pray for strength. Our annual remembrance of the incarnation (Advent) celebrates God's desire to become immersed in every aspect of the human experience and in our response – we will find Christ.
