Prayer has been called "an hour of truth." But it has to be the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. No doubt the Pharisee was telling the truth: he was living an upright life, he was doing everything he claimed to be doing. But he was not praying; he was giving God an inventory of his good deeds: "I fast, I give 10% of my income...." He had a good self-image: he prefaced it all by saying, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers...." But, just like the Pharisees, his high opinion of himself depended on his low opinion of others.

Yes, the Liturgy invites us to wear that cap and see if it fits. Most of us would be too clever to boast openly of the things we do, but there are subtle ways of putting others down in order to make ourselves appear better. How does it work? I am not sure what I am in myself (or I am afraid to look), so I develop an eye for the worst in other people. It allows me to say to myself that at least I'm not as bad as they are, or at any rate no worse. But no transformation comes about in this way, because I'm looking at the wrong person.

Jesus said, "Love your enemies." Love your opposite, don't just use them as a justification for not changing your own life. In time you may come to realise that the problems you have with them are precisely your own problems - your own problems projected. It is always useful to ask yourself, Why is this person my enemy? He touches something painful in me, reminds me of something I would rather forget. In the end I may even learn to say, "God, me merciful to me, a sinner!" That is the sincerest form of prayer: it is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

When you are ill and go to the doctor, it would not make much sense to tell the doctor about another person's illness. The doctor would not be able to treat you if you did not tell your own symptoms. If you were to do that you would go home again just as sick as when you went to see the doctor. The Pharisee came to God complaining about others' sins and did not go home with the peace of God in his heart. On the other hand, the tax collector came before God in complete humility, admitting who he really was, and went home at peace with God.

Throughout Scripture, we see God coming to those who know their need of God. The first reading this weekend from Ecclesiasticus reminds us that God does not have favourites and hears the cry of the oppressed and that the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds. In the second reading, Paul is also poor in spirit before God. Paul knows he will soon be martyred so he says he is already being poured out as a libation. A libation of wine was poured over sacrifices so Paul is indicating he knows his life will end in the sacrifice of martyrdom. All Paul's witnesses abandoned him when he had to defend himself. So, he is left with only the Lord to be with him. He wrote in our second reading "But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the proclamation might be completed, and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was rescued from the lion's mouth".

St. Paul too is living the attitude of the tax collector. He has no masks. What about us? Surely the Lord is saying to us in the parable that we have nothing to fear in approaching Him just as we are. In fact, it is the correct way to approach God because otherwise we block God out from our life.
