The Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is a universal theme: the foolishness of the wise, and the wisdom of the simple. As Touchstone put it in *As You Like It*, "The fool doth think he is wise, but the wise man knows himself to be a fool." Jesus had never been to rabbinical school, he had no doctorate, no degrees or diplomas of any kind; yet he constantly defeated the doctors of the law in argument, and the Pharisees. He set aside the political thinking of his time, and pointing to a child, he said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). Children must know something we used to know but have now forgotten. What have we forgotten? It won't come under the heading of information: children have very little of that, while we have too much. Our minds are full of information, like packing-material, most of which has no vital relevance to us at all. It's hard to accept that we learned all the important things long before we became these serious long-faced citizens. It could be time to reread Robert Fulghum's book, *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten* (1988). Jesus gives no solace to people who have lost the light touch of a child. He came, he said, to set us free: "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36).

There is no room in a child's mind for packing-material, because they are full of wonder. Jesus doesn't weigh us down with baggage. "My burden is light," he says in today's reading. But how can he say his burden is light, asked St Jerome (347–420), when he seemed in Matthew chapter 5 to make it far more demanding and burdensome than the Law of Moses? For example: "You have heard how it was said to the people long ago, 'Thou shalt not kill' (Exod 20:13)... but I say to you, Anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment..." (Mt 5:21).

"You have heard how it was said, 'Thou shalt not commit adultery' (Exod 20:14), but I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart" (Mt 5:27). "Again it was said, 'Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a certificate of divorce' (Deut 24:1), but I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for marital unfaithfulness, causes her to become an adulteress..." (Mt 5:31). Does Jesus, despite his words, lay a heavier burden on us?

Without wanting to trivialise Jerome's answer to his own question, you could say it amounts to this: in the Old Law you got credit only for succeeding, while in the New Law of the Gospel you get credit for trying. "By the Old Law works are required, while in the Gospel good will is required, which even if it does not bear fruit in action, does not lose its reward. The Old Law punished not the will but the act: for example it condemned the act of adultery, while the Gospel forbids lust, which is a matter of our will." Then he gives an illustration. "A virgin who was violated in time of war would still be considered a virgin under the Gospel, while under the Old Law she would be cast out as defiled."

Every child has a heart to begin with. Some of us outgrow it and stake our whole lives on what we know or on what we can do. But we can take it from an ancient monk (3rd or 4th century), that we will get nowhere without a heart. "If you have a heart, you can be saved."

MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

The Gospel this weekend begins by praising the Father, acknowledging that He is the source of all wisdom and understanding. This recognition reminds us of the humbling truth that our knowledge and insights ultimately come from God. As Catholics, we are called to approach the mysteries of faith with a humble and open heart, recognising that God's wisdom surpasses our limited human understanding. Next, Jesus invites all who are weary and burdened to Him for rest. This invitation is a source of immense comfort and solace, especially in times of trials, struggles, and weight of life's burdens. It is in His presence that we discover the true peace that surpasses all understanding.

Jesus does not promise a life free from challenges or difficulties, but He assures us that when we embrace His teachings and follow His example, we will find grace, strength, and a profound sense of purpose. The yoke of Christ, though it may involve sacrifice, is ultimately one that leads to freedom, fulfilment, and eternal life.

As we meditate on this weekend's Gospel, we are reminded of the importance of humility, childlike trust, and finding rest in Jesus. We are called to embrace the wisdom of God's Kingdom, surrendering our burdens to Him and following the path that Jesus has laid before us. May we strive to live out these teachings, seeking solace and guidance from our loving Saviour, and finding true rest and peace in His presence.
