The Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Water is the source of life. "On that day living waters shall flow out from Jerusalem," said the prophet Zechariah (14:8), prophesying the new age. "Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water," said Jesus (John 7:38), echoing many passages in the Scriptures.

Yet water also reminded the Jews of the Deluge of old and was therefore a symbol of destruction. The prophets used this symbol of the chaotic sea to speak about coming disasters. In its depths lurked "Leviathan the fleeing serpent, Leviathan the twisting serpent... the dragon that is in the sea" (Isaiah 27:1). Water, then, is a symbol of both life and death. (Both of these meanings are merged in baptism; by immersion in the baptismal waters we die to sin and self, but emerge into new life.)

In today's reading Jesus appears out of the night, "walking toward them on the sea." It is a symbol of his triumph over chaos and evil. The scene is full of symbolic association. Peter, the chief disciple, ventures into this dangerous element, and makes his way while he keeps his attention on the Lord, but he sinks once he begins thinking only about danger. With him it was an experiment: "if it is you...." 'If' is an expression of doubt, not of faith.

Peter's cry for help is a pure expression of prayer. Christians have long meditated on this. Here are some brief reflections from the great 19th-century preacher, C.H. Spurgeon: "Sinking times are praying times.... Short prayers are long enough.... There were but three words in the petition which Peter gasped out ("Lord, save me!"), but they were sufficient for his purpose.... Not length but strength.... A sense of need is a mighty teacher of brevity.... If our prayers had less of the tail feathers of pride and more wing, they would be all the better.... Verbiage is to devotion as chaff to wheat. Precious things lie in small compass, and all that is real prayer in many a long address might have been uttered in a petition as short as that of Peter."

MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

The Gospel story this weekend is a beautiful icon of the faith of the Apostle Peter. In the voice of Jesus who tells him: 'Come', he recognises the echo of the first encounter on the shore of that very lake, and right away, once again, he leaves the boat and goes toward the Teacher. And he walks on water! The faithful and ready response to the Lord's call always enables one to achieve extraordinary things. But Jesus himself told us that we are capable of performing miracles with our faith, faith in Him, faith in His word, faith in His voice. Peter, however, begins to sink the moment he looks away from Jesus, and he allows himself to be overwhelmed by the hardships around him. But the Lord is always there, and when Peter calls Him, Jesus saves him from danger. Peter's character, with his passion and his weaknesses, victorious, Christian faith walks to meet the Risen Lord, amid the world's storms and dangers.

All the little and frightened ones become great at the moment in which they fall on their knees and recognise the Son of God in their Teacher. How many times the same thing happens to us! Without Jesus, far from Jesus, we feel frightened and inadequate to the point of thinking we cannot succeed. Faith is lacking! But Jesus is always with us, hidden perhaps, but present and ready to support us.

This is an effective image of the Church; a boat which must brave the storms and sometimes seems on the point of capsizing. What saves her is not the still and courage of her crew members, but faith which allows her to walk, even in the dark, amid hardships. Faith gives us the certainty of Jesus' presence always besides us, of His hand which grasps us to pull us back from danger. We are all on this boat, and we feel secure here despite our limitations and our weaknesses. We are safe especially when we are ready to kneel and worship Jesus, the only Lord of our life.
